



MURPHY AWAY PROJECTS (MAP)

*Request for Proposals*

2012-2013 Guidelines



The Murphy Away Projects (MAP) program supports faculty and student literature and language projects that cannot be accomplished on the Hendrix campus. Each project trip will include one or two faculty members and up to ten students and will take place during the Spring Break or Summer of 2013. (Projects involving fewer than six students will be limited to one faculty member.) Proposals for projects ranging in cost from \$200 to \$20,000 are welcome.

**Focus:** All projects should center on the study of literature and language and all projects should have a tangible outcome for students such as an undergraduate research paper, a creative writing product, a reflective paper, or a language acquisition credit or certificate. All projects should include plans for on-campus dissemination of results after the project. An ideal proposal is the extension of the work done in a language and literature class at Hendrix.

**Projects:** Proposals should clearly describe **specific projects or outcomes** that students and faculty will complete during and/or after their travel, including deadlines for project completion and ways that students and faculty will share the results of their projects with the campus at large during the following year.

**Coordinator Responsibilities:** Faculty project coordinators are expected to handle travel and other arrangements, including selection and vetting of students, air and ground travel, lodging, and project activities on site. While Hendrix-Murphy staff are available for consultation, project preparation tasks are the responsibility of the project coordinator. To avoid academic staffing problems, the principal project coordinator should notify his or her departmental and area chairs via email cc when submitting the proposal. Other faculty participants should email cc their department chair.

**Deadline:**

December 14, 2012

for projects taking place during Spring Break or Summer of 2013.
