### Tim Trawick: “Fiddle Concert!”

### Riddle Elephant Sanctuary Trip

Riddle’s Elephant and Wildlife Sanctuary (Quitman, Arkansas) is home to the largest, privately-owned elephant herd in North America. It was established by Scott and Heidi Riddle in 1990 as a home for elephants and is the only internationally recognized sanctuary that accepts any elephant regardless of species, gender, or disposition. Student visitors will have the opportunity to tour the sanctuary, visit with elephants, and participate in a voluntary work project. Sign-ups will be held at lunch on Wednesday, June 27th, and a lottery will determine which students are selected to attend. Students should wear proper footwear for work – tennis shoes or boots – definitely not sandals or flip-flops! Students will be outside, so wear a hat and bring sunscreen and water.

### Bioblitz

AGS Bioblitz is a campus-wide event where students will try to find as many different species of plants, insects, and arthropods as they can! Teams will compete to see who can find the most species, and the winning team will receive Burrow Bucks as their prize. Warren Sconiers and Tim Trawick along with other faculty will help students identify specimens. Students can also bring their phones to use a companion app (iNaturalist) for taking pictures and collecting information to submit to others around the world to help identify species. With all of us together, we may even find a new species! Be sure to bring water, as this activity will involve moving around all over campus. Water bottles can be refilled in front of Mills.

### Kona Ice Shaved Ice Truck

Featuring paintings, sculptures, works on paper, photographs, site-specific installations and more, this exhibition showcases the renowned artwork of O'Keeffe, as well as artwork of American artists who found inspiration in her art. Lunch, dinner, and snacks will be provided. There is a gift shop, so you can bring money if you would like to shop there. Spots for this trip are limited, so sign-ups will be held on Monday, June 25th, on the Sun Porch during lunch, and a lottery will take place to pick who will go on the trip.
