### Gabby Vidal-Torreira: "Feminism and the Road to Gender Equality"

Come listen as Gabby discusses how the waves of feminism have brought women's rights forward over the course of the last century.

### Thirteenth (Discussion to follow)

The 13th Amendment to the U. S. Constitution abolished slavery. But it also included a provision many people don't know about and that is what this documentary brings to view. "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist." That exception justifies the use of forced labor as long as the laborer is a convict. This documentary makes the case that inclusion of this loophole is only one of the justifications for continuing domination of people of color. The 13th Amendment was ratified in 1865 and director Ava DuVernay supports her thesis through the use of both historical footage and interviews. The documentary makes the case that those drug busts, Jim Crow laws and segregation are all variations of domination of black America. Here DuVernay makes the case that the judicial system cannot be dealt with by making small changes. The system itself has to be rebuilt.

But did you know that Mary Wollstonecraft was addressing virtually the same sexist expectations facing women over 200 years earlier? Join RA Stevie Leigh for a stylistic comparison of Adichie's TED Talk *We Should All Be Feminists* (2013) and Wollstonecraft's *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman* (1792) to discover the striking similarities between the pieces of feminist rhetoric composed over two centuries apart.

#### Camile Richoux ('08): "The Naked Truth: Death by Delivery" (Two Parts)

Did you know that on average in the U.S., black women are four times more likely than other women to die during pregnancy and childbirth? Did you know that this statistic holds true regardless of income and education level? In this two-part seminar, watch the short documentary "The Naked Truth: Death by Delivery" and learn about what contributes to this epidemic and what is being done to protect women during pregnancy and after childbirth. In the film, Nelufar Hedayat travels from rural Georgia to New York City to investigate the complex landscape of pregnancy in the U.S. The film will be shown at 4:10, and the discussion of the film will take place at 6:10.
